Asound-proof **Audiology Room** has been set up at the YMCAKAMAK **Higher Secondary School for the Hearing Impaired** to analyze the hearing level of students. We are indeed thankful to Dr.N.Sethuraman, President of Mahasemam Trust, for sponsoring it.

The **Bakery Unit** at the school premises caters to orders from outside to produce and supply Loaves of bread and pastries besides being a demo unit for the Hearing Impaired learning a vocational skill. Kindly call us to execute your orders. Help us to help the Differently-abled!

We are also happy to inform you of the proposal to demolish the old **living block** in the YMCA **JP Kennett Boys' Home** and construct a new one in the place very soon. **Your Prayers and Contribution are essential.** The work is expected to start at an early date.

Awareness programs on the ill-effects of 'Sumangali' Scheme were organized and Campaign on 'Right to Education Act ' was carried out in villages of Thoothukudi district by the YMCA Rural Community Development Project.

150 children got actively engaged in Yoga, Karate, Table Tennis, Chess, Carom, Hand writing, Spoken English, Speed Maths, Abacus, Music, Drawing, Arts and Craft, Aerobics, Skating, Gymnastics, Self Beautician course, Liquid Embroidery with mirror work, Teracotta Jewellery, Best of Waste, western and classical dance etc., organized by YMCA in a **Summer Camp** this year.

District level Inter-School Carrom Tournament was conducted in collaboration with the Madurai District Carrom Association in which 120 students took part.


While Paper cup - making and candle - production skills are promoted at the **Special School for the Mentally Challenged**, the mothers who wait to take home their children are given training in producing banana fibre products. Every year volunteers from German YMCA join us at the school for 6-8 months and help the students in their special education.

We are sure the **International Youth Centre (IYC)** will become fully functional at the very earliest with the blessings of Our Lord Almighty.

Evening Study Centre, partially supported by YMCA Denmark, functions on the principles of community participation and self-help. 75 school-going children attend free tuition classes in the evening. There is some time also for games, togetherness and learning something good.

There are 50 children in the **Play School.** They are from socially and economically backward families of Muthupatti. Health and hygiene are given priority at the School. The School takes on the role of day care, keeping the children safe till the mothers return from work and collect them.

YMCA Sports and Wellness Centre located in Alagappan Nagar has facilities for children and adults from the surrounding areas for getting coached as well as playing Tennis, Badminton, Skating, Cricket, and Karate. Special coaching is also undertaken during summer vacation. Fitness through Gymnasium and Walk – Track is also available. Around 175 persons utilize the facilities at the Centre.

World YMCA/YWCA Week of Prayer was observed by YMCA and YWCA from 12th to 17th November 2018 on the theme, "Youth Empowerment for Good".
