Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The year 2023 – 2024, has been a miraculous year experiencing God's wonderful ways of leading the movement. In spite of the challenges, God has been merciful and we could meet all the project needs and the services were carried out very effectively. This is the Lord's doing and it is marvelous in our eyes.

The dedicated services of YMCA Madural to the children with hearing impairment, intellectual disability, less privileged and orphaned, skill trainings and sports activities were continued successfully by the abundant mercy of our Lord. He has been directing our paths as a guide and enabled us to find favour in the eyes of kind hearted friends and philanthropists in carrying out this mission. Our hope in Him did not go in vain and we thankfully praise God for He is our Provider.

All the planned activities for children, staff and the community were accomplished well and proper. We had an addition of rooms at the Women's Hostel during the year which would fetch additional income to our services. I am thankful to all our local and international friends and donors for their generous support.

I am extremely thankful to the Board of Directors of YMCA Madurai who selflessly contribute their time and energy for the YMCA. Very specially, I extend my thanks to the Office Bearers, Chairpersons and members of various Committees for their immense support and guidance at all times. I am sure, the panoramic view of this report with various happenings during the year would encourage and enthuse your association with this historical movement.



YMCA SERVICES CENTRE FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED

The YMCA KAMAK Higher Secondary School for the Hearing Impaired established in the year 1971 offers quality education for the children and young people with hearing impairment.

During the year 2023 -2024, we had a total of 173 students (103 Boys and 70 Girls) including 27 Girls at the Integrated Education programme,



from Preschool to XII standard. The services were effectively implemented by 23 teaching and 11 non teaching staff. The school hostel provided a comfortable and happy environment for 54 boys and 26 girls.

24 students of X standard and 26 students of XII standard appeared for the Government examination and achieved centum pass.

Thanks to our valuable donors, the school was technologically upgraded with 10 computers for students, 6 smart televisions for the classrooms, a digital audiometer and a copier machine. Our special thanks to the Canara Bank Regional Office Madurai, Amphenol Omniconnect Chennai and the Rotary Club of Madurai for their generous sponsorship.



Special Sensitization Campaigns were organized to

create awareness in the Community on prevention of disability and on the importance of educating children with disabilities in Dindigul, Natham, Andipatti and Usilampatti areas during June 2023. Special children who were kept at home without any education were identified and counseled for admission into the YMCA Special schools.

International Yoga Day was observed on 21st June 2023 to explain the benefits of practicing Yoga to students in their everyday life. Mrs. Nirmala Nirmalraj was the resource person.

International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, International Plastic free day, International Day of Sign Languages, International Day of the Deaf were observed at the School and the students were enlightened on the respective topics.

Education Development Day was observed on 15th July 2023 with students participating in



competitions such as coloring, drawing, collage, mono acting and drama reflecting on the personality of the former Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru.K.Kamaraj, who was instrumental in promoting the education of poor people and free Noon meals scheme.

Annual Sports Day was conducted on 10th August 2023 and our students participated in various events with great enthusiasm.





77th Independence Day was celebrated on 15th August 2023. Mr.Jayakumar, CSR Manager of the Muthoot Finance Ltd was the Special Guest and he hoisted the National Flag. Fr. J. Benadict Barnabas, President and Dr.J.Sathiah, Treasurer YMCA Madurai graced the occasion with their presence. Children performed mass drill, fancy dress performance and cultural events remembering the great freedom fighters.

Our students participated and won prizes at the Interschool Competitions organized by Thendral Association and the Madurai Ladies Circle.

Teachers' Day was celebrated on 5th September 2023 and the students greeted the special educators with roses, chocolates and gifts.

Parent Teachers Meeting was organized on 13th October 2023. Mrs. J. Shamila Doris, Correspondent, welcomed the gathering. Ms. Ashwini Veronica, Assistant Professor from the American College was the Resource Person. She motivated the parents to challenge the community by way of ignoring all the negative comments. Ms. Arul Mary Sinthiya, ISL Trainer, emphasized the necessity of learning Indian Sign Language and lip-reading skills to communicate with their children and taught communicative sign language to 70 parents who participated in the meeting.

Children's Day was celebrated on 23rd November 2023. Mr.TV. Krishna Mohan, General Manager, Canara Bank, was the Chief Guest. He inaugurated the five computers sponsored by the Canara Bank. Students performed dances and skits on the occasion and they were highly appreciated.





Industrial visits to Niranjana Weaving Factory and Aravind Chettinadu Snacks Company were organized to impart practical knowledge of the weaving process, fabric production and snack manufacturing and marketing to the XIIth Std students on 28th November 2023.

Christmas Function was celebrated at the School on

9th December 2023. Mr. Basheer Anver Tayub, one of our generous donors and well-wishers, was the Chief Guest. He expressed his happiness in supporting a good cause. He conveyed Christmas greetings and sponsored Christmas gifts to the children and staff.



2024. Children and staff dressed up in traditional wears took part in the celebration with joy. Pongal was prepared and distributed to the students along with sugarcane.

Republic Day was celebrated on 26th January 2024. Our students with hearing impairment were invited by the Canara Bank Regional Office to perform the National Anthem in Indian Sign Language and were specially honored.

Career Guidance Program was organised for the outgoing students on 14th February 2024. Ms. Pandeeshvari, Proprietor of Jaya Meenakshi Group of Institutions, oriented the students on various skill training programs and motivated them to pursue their passionate field of interest. Her team conducted a training on photoshop and beauty course for the students to gain knowledge in photo editing, Corel Draw, hair styling and make up.

Training on Indian Sign language was conducted on 17th February 2024. Mr. Velmurugan, ISL trainer, taught the specific signs for numbers, colors, relations and digital media science.



Pleasure trip to Kodaikanal and Meghamalai, Exposure visit to Kalaingar Centenary Library, Awareness on Health and Hygiene, Medical Camps, Diwali celebrations and Handwriting Trainings were organized for the students during the year.







Farewell Event to the students of Class XII was organized on 19th March 2024. Mrs. J. Shamila Doris, Correspondent & General Secretary, YMCA Madurai, encouraged the students to succeed in their future and offered prayers for them. Ms. Vanaja, Supervisor, Auro Lab shared about job opportunities available at Aurolab for the hearing impaired students.

Training in Bakery skills for 69 students of 6th to 9th grade along with their curriculum was conducted. Production of bread, cookies, bun and stuffed snacks were undertaken. The Bakery Outlet offers employment opportunities for persons with hearing impairment.





YMCA SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR INTELLECTUALLY DISABLED

The YMCA Special School for the Intellectually Disabled established in the year 2000 offers effective special education to children with various types of mental disabilities such as Down Syndrome, Autism with Retardation and Cerebral Palsy.

During the year 2023 -2024, we had a total of 82 children (57 Boys and 25 Girls) at the School. The services were effectively implemented by 12 teaching, 12 non- teaching staff and 1 Physiotherapist. The School hostel provided a safe accommodation and nutritious food for 22 students. Training in academics, daily living skills, social skills, behavior modification,



sensory stimulation, speech and language development were offered to the children.



With the expertise of trained professionals and special educators, a special curriculum was designed and developed on 7 domains [Motor skill, Activities of Daily Living Skills, Language(Receptive, Expressive), Reading/Writing, Number/Time, Domestic/Social, Prevocational / Money]. The children were trained and assessed on a quarterly basis.

Training in basic food preparation, gardening and computer skills were taught to the children additionally.



Physiotherapy is offered for the children who require training in mobility and motor skills. Training in Sensory Stimulation and Integration is given to the children for enhancing the use of senses effectively.

During this year, we have integrated 4 students with intellectual disability at the City Middle School, Ansari Nagar, in Standard VIII. The



students happily attend the classes along with the regular children and return back to YMCA Special School for resource support. This indeed is a great success for the efforts of our special educators in the School.

On a regular basis, the special educators visit the homes of our children, meet the families of children, update them on the developments, challenges and explain to them the areas which needed more attention. They also guide and counsel the parents to give special care for the children and encourage them to accept the reality.

World Autism Awareness Day was observed on 3rd April 2023. Various games were conducted for the children with Autism and they were honored. The orientation session conducted for the caretakers on the characteristics of children with Autism helped the Care takers to understand the issue of disability better.

The Skill Development Centre for Mothers sponsored by the CVJM, Germany, was dedicated to the glory of God on 22nd May 2023. Dr.S.Manual Jayaraj, offered the dedication prayer. Mr.Gnana. Surabhi Mani, Former President, YMCA Madurai, inaugurated the Centre in the presence of the Board of Directors, and staff. General Secretary, Mrs.J.Shamila Doris, introduced the project and thanked the leaders. A special appreciation was recorded for the generous support from CVJM and Mr.Jeyasuresh Jayaraj who sponsored the RCC roofing.





International Yoga Day was observed on 21st June 2023. Our Special educators taught various yoga poses and its benefits to the children for their body fitness. All the Special children enthusiastically performed yoga taught by the special educator.

77th Independence Day was celebrated on 15th August 2023. Mrs and Mr. Manikandan, Director,



Shri Hari Exports, our donors and well wishers, were the Special Guests and they hoisted the National Flag. Children performed mass drill, fancy dress performance and cultural events remembering the great freedom fighters.

Exposure Visits for the children were arranged to several places during the year. On 24th August 2023, the students visited the Madurai Railway Station and learnt to use the escalators and they were also oriented on the uses of the ticket counters, platforms, vendors and trains. On 25th August 2023, they were taken on an exposure visit to the Kalaignar Centenary Library by the special educators. They were amazed to see all the bookshelves and the beautiful arrangements. On 1st September 2023, they were given an experience of watching movie in a Cinema Theatre. On 8th September 2023, Children were taken to the Rajaji Park accompanied by the special educators and caretakers. Every visit was a new learning for them.



Parent Teacher Meetings were organized on 20th September 2023 and on 27th February 2024. Mr.Deepan Meshack, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology, the American College, was the resource person. He had a discussion with the parents on the various difficulties faced while handling children at home and counseled them with proper guidance. He encouraged the parents to

spend time with children for their own happiness to reduce stress and strain. Ms.Renuka, Counselor trainee from the Madurai Institute of Social Sciences, shared detailed instructions to parents on how they could contribute to the holistic development of their special child. Parents participated enthusiastically in the meeting.

Training in Tailoring for the Community Women was inaugurated on 9th October 2023. Fr.J.Benadict Barnabas, President, conducted the prayer service. Dr.Prabakar Navamani, Former President and Chairman of the School, inaugurated the training and invoked God's blessings. Mr. Jeyasuresh Jayaraj, Former President, sponsored 10 pedal Sewing Machines to the centre. Dr. Prabakar Navamani sponsored the sewing chairs for the tailoring machines.



Our children participated in various games at the World Mental Health Day Celebrations organized at JC Residency on 10th October 2023. K.Syed Akthar got 2nd prize for Puzzles matching.

Diwali, the festival of lights, was celebrated on 10th October 2023. The students enjoyed the celebration along with their parents. Sweets and crackers were distributed as part of the celebration.

Children's Day was celebrated on 16th November 2023. Children enthusiastically participated in activities such as games and hand printing and won prizes.



Medical Camp was organized in association with the CSI College of Nursing, Madurai, on 21st November 2023. General medical checkup was conducted by the Doctors and they provided guidance and medical advice to the special students and staff. On 23rd November 2023, the students from the CSI College of Nursing celebrated Advent Christmas with the children with songs and nativity play, which was enjoyed by them.

Christmas Function was celebrated on 15th December 2023. Mrs. Jessy Tagore Davidson was the Special Guest and she shared the Christmas message. Mrs.Cruz Saleth Valarmathi, a donor and well wisher, graced the occasion with her presence. Children performed dances and enacted the nativity play to spread the message of hope among the guests and the gathering. Christmas gifts were distributed to the students with a sumptuous lunch sponsored by Mr.Sebesthian, our well-wisher and donor.

Pongal Festival was celebrated on 12th January 2024. The significance of celebrating the harvest festival was explained to the children. Pongal was prepared by the special educators and distributed to the students. Children enjoyed the Pongal and sugarcane.

A one-day session on good touch and bad touch was arranged for the students by 'Young Indians,' an NGO, on 6th February 2024. Ms. Karthiga Devi, Ms. Kalavathi and Ms. Hema of the 'Young Indians', were the Resource Persons. The importance of educating the children about good touch and bad touch was briefly explained to the staff, caretakers and parents.

"Bracelet Making" with beads was introduced for the children on 22nd February 2024. Mrs. Anajala, Special educator, taught the children how to make bracelets with suitable colour and combination and proper alignment of beads. This activity of stringing beads strengthened the fine motor skills and the children enjoyed making beautiful bracelets and wore them on their wrists.

Our children participated at the Inter School Competitions organized by the Nandanam School, Madurai, on 5th March 2024 based on the theme "Environmental Building" and took part actively in puzzle matching, balloon blowing etc. S.Fridolin and K.Yogeswari from our School won the 1st prize in puzzle matching, A. Nagavishnu and K. Akthar won the 1st prize in balloon blowing.

A session on **Stress Relief Management** was conducted for the Special Educators on 15th March 2024. Ms. Sujitha, Counselor Trainee, handled the session. Through games, music and dance, she explained

stress relief techniques for the special educators which were very helpful.

World Down Syndrome Day was observed on 21st March 2024. Children with Down Syndrome were specially honored.

A one day Pleasure Trip was arranged for the special children to Vagamon, Kerala with the sponsorship of Mr. Jaison and family, PJJ Fruits,





Madurai, on 23rd March 2024. Children travelled with special educators and Caretakers. They enjoyed the whole day at the adventure park, Pine forest, Vagamon meadows, and relaxation at the resort. They enjoyed the sumptuous meal served by the donor's family. During the travel the children were excited to see the tea plantations and mountain bends which were a



new experience for them. They visited the

Pattumalai Madha Church which was an amazing experience for them. For the special educators, it

was a refreshing trip with lot of impressions and memories.



Training in Candle Making is imparted to 5 of our students - 3 boys and 2 girls.

Training in Jute and Banana Fibre Products is offered to mothers of our children. They are trained to make handbags, purses, pouches, lunch bags etc. The products

made by the children and the mothers are displayed for sale at the skill training outlet.



The Skill Development Centre for Women offers training in Tailoring

 to make blouses, inskirts, night wears, long frocks and pillow covers. We propose to initiate training in Aari work.



The Special School offers employment opportunities

for 3 Intellectually Disabled persons who are above the age of 22.

YMCA J.P. KENNET BOYS' HOME

YMCA J.P. Kennet Boys' Home initiated in the year 1954 is situated at Alagappan Nagar. Madurai. It has been a home for more than 2000 boys over the past years and was instrumental in offering a qualified and dignified life for them. During the year, one of our inmates V. Jeya Prakash completed standard XII successfully and is





pursuing his engineering course. Another inmate of the home M. Sanjay is doing final year Bachelors Degree. Application for new JJ Act Registration has been submitted to the District Child Protection Office and we are looking forward to the approval to admit new inmates who need care and support in the home. The meeting hall at the Boys' Home was utilized to conduct trainings and meetings during the year.

YMCA SPORTS AND WELLNESS CENTRE

YMCA Madurai Sports and Wellness Centre, initiated in the year 2010 at Alagappan Nagar, offers quality services for the young people and adults to take care of their body, mind and spirit. The facilities for playing badminton, tennis, cricket, football and skating including walking track attract around 200 - 250 children and adults everyday to the Fitness Centre. Trained coaches, appointed for each activity, take care of the trainings.

Summer Training Programs were organized from 17th April to 17th May 2023 at the Centre. Around 80 students participated in different activities such as Skating, Tennis, Chess, and Handwriting. Certificates were distributed to the participants.

The Kiddle Castle Preschool, Madurai, conducted their Annual Sports Day at our premises on 10th February 2024.

The Sunrise Mountain Roller Skating Academy, Madurai Speed Skating Association, SRM Roller Skating Championship, and the Boaj Skating Academy conducted several competitions at the YMCA Skating rink.

Thanks to God, our friends and well wishers, the renovation work of the Fitness Centre at the campus was initiated during the year. We propose to lay new concrete flooring at the ground floor, replacing the tiled roofing with metal roofing, laying floor tiles at the first floor and attend to the required electrical, repairing and painting works.











YMCA 1st Open State Level Skating Championship was organized on 28th January 2024 at the Centre. 283 competitors of different age groups from all over Tamil Nadu participated in various skating categories and showcased their skating skills. Winners were honoured with prizes and medals. Mr.Rishwanth Joshua Jayaraj, Board Member, YMCA Madurai sponsored the medals and certificates. Our sincere thanks to him and the JC Residency for their support. Chairman Mr. G. Jayasingh Thiyagaraj distributed the medals and certificates to the winners. Our thanks to Mr.Bala Murugan, Senior Skating coach, for organizing the event.



YMCA CAMPSITE

YMCA Campsite at Utchapatty near Thirumangalm is developed as an eco friendly farm and a haven for the cricket lovers in Madurai. A Cricket pitch at the campsite is used regularly by various cricket associations in Madurai. Country Chicken and Goats are raised at the camp site. Currently there are 26 goats and 6 hens.



The Cricket Pitch at the Campsite is used by the Future Cricket Academy during weekends.



Children from the YMCA School for the Mentally Challenged visited the Campsite for an outdoor



activity trip on 29th November 2023. Children enjoyed playing there. Special educators and Caretakers cooked food for the children and everyone enjoyed the day.

YMCA ST. MARTIN'S MODEL FARM & YMCA APPASAMY RURAL TRUST **PROJECT**

YMCA St. Martin's Model Farm is situated at Kayathar, Tuticorin District. Goat farming and Poultry farming with country chicken are raised in the site and they are available for sale.

The Training Centre available at the Centre is hired by Churches and other organizations to conduct Camps and Retreats for their participants.







YMCA EVENING STUDY CENTRE AND PLAY SCHOOL, MUTHUPATTY

The project of Evening Study Centre and Play School is functioning at the YMCA Programme Centre at Muthupatty since 2007. This project offers afterschool supplementary education for 50 children from I to XII standards and nursery education for 30 kindergarten children from the families of the daily wage earners in and around Muthupatty. The Project



Coordinator along with 3 tutors and 2 support staff implement the activities of the Evening Study Centre and Play School.

Clean drinking water and washroom facilities are available for the children to clean themselves after play time. Nutritious refreshments are offered to the children, which help them to gain energy for the study time which in turn results in better academic performance.

School bags, lunch bags, uniforms, footwears and everyday nutritious refreshments are offered to the children at the Play School. Children enjoy learning rhymes and stories through the digital classes.

Special attention and coaching at the Study Centre were given to the students who appeared for the X and XII standard Government examinations during April 2023.

Summer Training in Spoken English and Computers was offered for 30 students from 7th to 10th grade during the month of May 2023. Mrs. Shantha Caroline Mary and Mr. E. Vinoth Raja, B.E., were the tutors. Students were introduced to basic computer knowledge, usage of internet and email. In English, day to day usage of vocabulary and grammar were taught. Mr. G. Jebaraj, Secretary, and Mr. J. Justin, Chairman, distributed the course certificates to the children.

Vacation Bible School was conducted from 24th to 26th May 2023, for the children on the topic "Chosen". A team of directors, under the leadership of Mr.Stephen Jeyakumar, taught bible verses and songs. Stories related to the topic were shared with the children.







Welcome Day was organised for the children on the start of the new academic year on 21st June 2023. Mrs. Mangayarkarasi, and Mrs.Iswariya, teachers welcomed the children happily with flowers, chocolates. Mrs.J.Shamila Doris, General Secretary, was present and greeted the children.

Handwriting Classes were initiated for the students at the Evening Study Centre on 8th July 2023 and they were brought into regular practice. Handbooks were introduced to the children at the Play School and the updates were communicated to the parents.

Education Development Day was observed on 21st & 22nd of July 2023. Competitions on drawing, dance and fancy parade was conducted for the children. Through these competitions they got the chance to know about the life of Thiru.K.Kamaraj, eminent Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, who strived for the education of poor children. Prizes awarded to the children.

Special Uniforms for kids to wear on Wednesdays were introduced during this academic year and T-Shirts printed with YMCA Logo and School name and shorts was distributed to the children at the play school on 10th August 2023.



77th Independence Day was celebrated on 15th August 2023. Mr.J.Justin, Member of the Board and Chairman YMCA Evening Study Centre and Play School, hoisted the flag. Children performed mass drill, fancy dress and cultural events in remembrance of the great freedom fighters. Sweets were distributed to the children.



Exposure Visit to Keezhadi Heritage Museum was organized for the children by the Evening Study Centre on 7th October 2023. They enjoyed the travel and were amazed to see the treasures of the Sangam age.

A Session on Yoga was organized for the children

in view of the World Mental Health Day on 10th October 2023. Mrs. Nirmala Nirmalraj, Psychologist and a well-wisher, taught the children a few asanas to help improve their mental health and brain activity.





An Education Visit was organized for teachers to the YWCA Nursery and Primary school, Madurai, on 12th October 2023. Mrs. Shanthi Esther, Headmistress of the School, took them around the school and explained in detail about all the activities pursued and the registers and schedules kept at the YWCA School. It was very informative.



Parent Teacher Meeting was conducted on 17th October 2023 for the children at the Play School and report cards were given to the parents. They were also motivated to focus on the health of the child and were asked to give additional care and support in learning and writing skills.

Diwali was celebrated at the Play School and Study Centre on 10th November 2023. Mr.G. Jebaraj, Executive Secretary, YMCA Marthandam, was present and distributed Diwali sweets to the children. Children enjoyed the day with crackers and sweets.

Pleasure Trip to Thirupparankundram park was arranged for the children by the Playschool on 15th November 2023. They enjoyed the eco friendly environment and happily played games in the park. Snacks were distributed to the children.



Children's Day was celebrated at the School on 17th November 2023. Mrs. J. Shamila Doris, General Secretary, YMCA Madurai, welcomed the gathering. Ms. Shanthi Esther, Headmistress, YWCA Nursery and Primary School, was the Chief Guest. Her talk was an encouragement to the children and parents who were present. Children showcased their talents through dance and fancy dress.

Nutrition Day was observed for the parents on 24th November 2023. Mrs. Radha Maheswari, Physiotherapist, was the Resource Person. She explained the importance of food, health and nutrition and the do's and dont's in maintaining proper health.

a) General

i) Exclusive Method
